1. Read Galatians 1:13 -24

Instead of giving us a simple formula for change, Paul tells us his story of conversion to Christ. Here's a brief outline of what he said:

> My Former Life - He tells how he was raised in Judiasm. Judiasm was a religion where doing something meant everything. People took pride in their religious education and their religious busyness. A relationship with God was a matter of keeping lots of rules for a God who was on the outside of your life rather than on the inside.

God's Revelation - For Paul God moved from the "outside" to the "inside" when he appeared to Paul (then his name was Saul) in a bright light on the road to Damacus (see Acts 9). Suddenly Paul realized that love him and had always loved him. From then on Paul realized that true religion was not a matter of knowing and doing something for God, but rather letting God do something for you (ie. save you, forgive you, bless you, command you, etc.)

Solitary Retreat - Paul said, "I went away to Arabia..." If God's going to work in us we have to take time to get away from the distractions of life and spend time alone with him. Like you are doing this weekend.

Sharing Our Stories - Paul said, "I went to visit Cephas (Peter)." The word "visit" means "swap stories". Paul probably ask Peter, "How did God get ahold of you?" Peter probably said something like, "On the beach in the Galilee." Over conversion stories are all different, but the same in many ways.

Sharing "The Story" - God set Paul free to live well and bless others. God does not want us to live our Christianity privately. He wants it to over flow into other's lives. He said in Matt. 28:19, "... as you go into all the world spread the Good News of freedom in Christ"

### **INFORMATION SHEET**

### What?

Wilderness Trek is a rugged six day adventure that includes backpacking, hiking, rappelling, devotionals, Bible study, spiritual growth activities, and a climb to the summit of at least one 13,000 or 14,000 foot mountain.

It is specifically designed to challenge young people from 13 to 18 to discover self-confidence, self-esteem, personal faith, and to learn of the awesome potential for powerful Christian daily living.

### When?

Wilderness Trek may be scheduled from the last week in May through the last week in August. Each Wilderness Trek includes 6 days of scheduled activities. Each week of the summer, there are two Trek schedules:

> Saturday through Friday Sunday through Saturday

Participation can be on an individual or group basis. Any teen over 13 is eligible to participate regardless of race, religion, or sex. Young people under 14 years of age must be accompanied by a parent. Adult sponsors are welcome.

### Cost?

The cost of Wilderness Trek is \$220.00 per participant. This fee provides for basic backpacking equipment, insurance, food, guide and outfitting services, Trek journals, T-shirt, banquet, and the experiencel The participant or group must provide personal clothing and transportation to and from the outfitters rendezvous point in Colorado.

### How is it organized?

WTCC provides a Reservation Agreement to all groups or individuals who desire to participate in Wilderness Trek. The WTCC Executive Director will schedule your week of Trek and will coordinate all details with an Adult Contact from your group. WTCC will provide all materials for organizing your Wilderness Trek.

### Safety?

During all Wilderness Trek activities, safety is paramount. WTCC continues to pursue well-trained and qualified guides who plan for the safety of all Wilderness Trek participants.

### Goals:

Wilderness Trek is a ministry and has been since its beginning. Its original design was to create an atmosphere of challenge for the specific development of leadership among young people. It has since grown to affect a large number of people, and to affect them in different ways. However, the underlying goals have been the same: to provide a situation in which people can learn more about the everyday reality of God in their lives. By pursuing a selected spiritual theme, Wilderness Trek teaches spiritual applications to each day's activities. Participating teens provide the leadership, therefore encouraging personal growth in character and responsibility.

### Structure?


Each group participating in Wilderness Trek is organized into crews of 10. Crew Leaders (from your group), prepared in advance for their responsibilities, guide the crew in their daily tasks. Staff and adults participate as crew members.

### Daily activities:

worship - Sunday
rappelling
backpacking and hiking
daily campfire devotionals
summit attempt
establishing campsites
spiritual growth activities
skit night
banquet and awards
closing devotional
crew mealtimes

### Where?

Wilderness Trek conducts its activities in the National Forest of central Colorado. You will meet our outfitters at a designated rendezvous point and from there go into the mountains. Below is a map of the area where Wilderness Treks will take place:



### What's supplied -

WTCC participants bring their clothing and personal items and transfer them to a backpack. A list of recommended clothing and personal gear will be supplied to assist each person in determining what to bring. You won't need to buy special clothing or items—you probably already have what is needed for the Trek experiencel
